

SCHOOL ADMISSIONS CONSULTATION 2026/27

Kings Langley School is consulting on the proposed admissions arrangements for the school year 2026/27 and is seeking responses from parent/carers, schools and community groups.

The proposed changes are adding the following new rule:

Rule 3 - Children with a parent who is a permanent full-time or part-time member of the school staff (inclusive of teaching and support staff roles).

The consultation period runs from 28 October—8 December 2024. Please send your comments regarding the proposal to the school via email to admin@kls.herts.sch.uk

Hertfordshire County Council is also running a consultation on the proposed admissions arrangements for community and voluntary controlled schools for the school year 2026/27 and is seeking responses from parent/carers, schools and community groups.

School Admissions Consultation 2026/27

The consultation on Hertfordshire County Council's school admission arrangements for 2026/27 is open until 8 December 2024.

The county council proposes to:

- Reduce the published admission number (PAN) at 4 community or voluntary controlled primary schools for 2026/27.
- Retain the remainder of the County Council's existing admission arrangements, including PANs, Relevant Areas and schemes of coordination.

It is **Anti-Bullying Week** in the UK, but bullying is an issue that all parents and schools everywhere have to consider.

Children of all ages can benefit from learning to recognise what bullying looks like and understanding the right steps to take when it occurs.

With the help of Tooled Up, there is plenty that parents can do at home to support these conversations.

Professor James O'Higgins Norman of Dublin University is one of the foremost experts on bullying in schools. In this fascinating <u>conversation</u> with Dr Kathy Weston, he describes practical steps that parents and schools can take in tackling it, and shares the best resources available.

Bullies thrive on the silence and complicity of bystanders. We would love our children to be "upstanders" who challenge harmful behaviour. Read these <u>tips</u> on raising an upstander, and then read Dr Elly Hanson's <u>advice</u> on helping children challenge harmful talk in their peer group.

To develop this dialogue at home, use these <u>Conversation Starters</u> for discussing core family values.

If your child feels vulnerable to bullying it can often be linked to feelings of being different or left out. This <u>Belonging Journal</u> can help — it asks teens to consider their network of friends, their strengths and how they fit in.










STEM Challenge
