While you have more time to talk to your children over the half term break, we would like to revisit our online safety guidance. We advise open conversations with children regarding interactions with their friends online whether that is through their mobile phones or online gaming platforms. After the recent Online Safety Act (2023), online developers are being held more accountable for the content visible to children. However, as educators and parents, we need to be aware that young people are not always alert to the dangers online and how to stay safe. We would like to recommend the PhoneSmart licence as a way of supporting parents with these conversations. The licence is free, and you enter a prize draw to win an Xbox Series X.

Who is PhoneSmart Licence for?

PhoneSmart has been created for children, aged 10-13.

While we do not recommend children under 11 having smartphones, this is a tool for parents and guardians to help gauge their child's readiness for the responsibilities of smartphone ownership. It is also there to help navigate bigger conversations about the risks they might face online.

#### **Our Goal**

We believe phones should be used for good, not hate so we want to help parents to empower their children with the knowledge and skills they need to stay safe and happy online.




#### **Drama News**

#### King's Langley GOES RED to support Anti – Racism



On Friday 18<sup>th</sup> of October, we painted KLS RED to show our commitment towards anti-racism. Wear Red Day is an annual event organised by the education charity, 'Show Racism the Red Card'. Each year, schools and offices across the country are encouraged to wear red in an effort to solidify their dedication towards creating a more equal and inclusive society.

This year staff and students all wore red ribbons and a series of special assemblies led by our very own Anti – Racism champions were held to mark this significant event. Mr Scott, Mr Moyo, Mrs Ashraf and Catherine (12ANE) and Sai (12ANE) all organised and led discussions about

racism and race related issues and how we must all do our bit to stamp out racism related behaviour wherever we see it. Below are some of the tips that we discussed on how to become an active antiracist ally:

#### Start by challenging your own friends!

Using questions such as "What do you mean by that?" or "How is that funny?" can make people rethink what they are saying. Racist related comments are usually only shared around people that we are comfortable with, so challenging friends is a significant opportunity to be an active anti-racist ally.

#### Check in with people to see if they are okay!

If you witness that somebody is upset or uncomfortable about comments by another person, please ask them if they are ok! Making someone aware that you are there for them can make a big difference to how somebody feels.

#### Listen more, Talk Less.

It is okay to not know everything. What is more important is that you listen to others instead of trying to take over.


