

Year 7 May 2025 Exams – Overview

Activities in PE change each five weeks, with short practical assessments taking place at the end of this period. There is therefore no single examination in PE, with the 'Exam Grade' on reports based on average performance across each recent assessment.

Exam grades in Art are based on continual assessments of students' work across lessons and there is therefore no single Exam scheduled for these subjects.

Exam grades in Music are based on continual assessments of students' practical work, and baseline and End of Unit Tests across lessons and there is therefore no single Exam scheduled.

There is no exam in DT and Food.

Students will not sit a formal assessment for History in Summer Term 1".

Non-Fiction writing (Letter task)	Students are encouraged to read a range of non-fiction either from the library or as their own school reader and to read this either alone or aloud to someone at home. A practice paper for non-fiction reading comprehension will be done in class and students may take their books home to revise.
Maths	Test Format: Two 40 minutes tests, one non-calculator and one calculator paper. Each paper is worth 50 marks. Students are expected to bring their own equipment including a scientific calculator.	Topics covered in the test: Unit 4 – Percentages Unit 5 – Fractions Unit 6 – Introduction to Algebra Unit 7 – Solving Linear Equations in One Variable Unit 8 – Collecting, Organising and Displaying Data	The best way to revise Maths is to Do Maths, the main resource we use for revision is vle.mathswatch.co.uk; students can use the "sign in with Microsoft" button to access this. All students have access to a list of topics that gives details about which MathsWatch videos to watch. This topic list can be found at the bottom of the maths subject page in the learning areas section of the website.



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			Students are encouraged to use their feedback sheets from class based tests and other assessments to identify weaker topics and revise these.
			Class teachers will also set a revision task on MathsWatch and post the topic list on Teams.

These can also be found in your workbooks, which are sent home. You should also look at your past end-of-topic tests to remind yourself of the types of questions you may get. Revision strategies: Ask a family member to ask you the core questions. Make a note of any you got wrong and learn them again. Repeat the above steps until you can easily recall the answers. Use the summaries to make mind maps or flash cards. Revise a section at a time by reading, covering and writing what you can remember. Revision should be active, not just reading the information. Don't try to revise all the topics the night before. Spread your revision out. See your teacher if you'd like more help with your revision.
